Frank Barry is a graduate of the University of Massachusetts-Boston Harbor Campus. He has held teaching credentials in Massachusetts, New Hampshire, and California. He was a linguist in the United States Air Force for eight years 1965-1973 (Indonesian, Vietnamese, and Hebrew languages). His tours of duty

included: Japan, Okinawa, Vietnam, and on his second enlistment-Greece.

In tours to Da Nang, he was a Voice Intercept Processing Specialist listening in to the communications of the North Vietnamese Air Force while flying orbits in the Gulf of Tonkin recording conversations between Hanoi Gia Lam tower and Mig aircraft. He later transcribed these conversations which were sent to intelligence agencies.

Honors include:

- The Air Medal with seven Oak Leaf Clusters for meritorious achievement while participating in aerial flight,
- USAF Certificate of Training for successfully completing the Voice Intercept Processing Specialist Course at Goodfellow AFB, Texas.
- USAF Certificate of Training for successfully completing the 12 Week Intensive Vietnamese Language Training at the Institute of Modern Languages in Washington, D.C.
